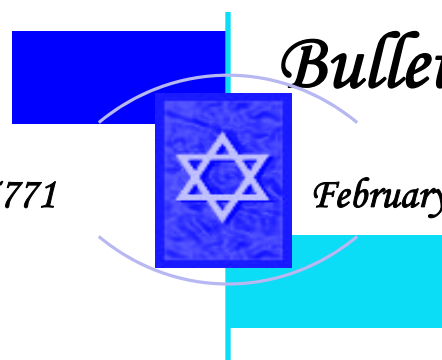

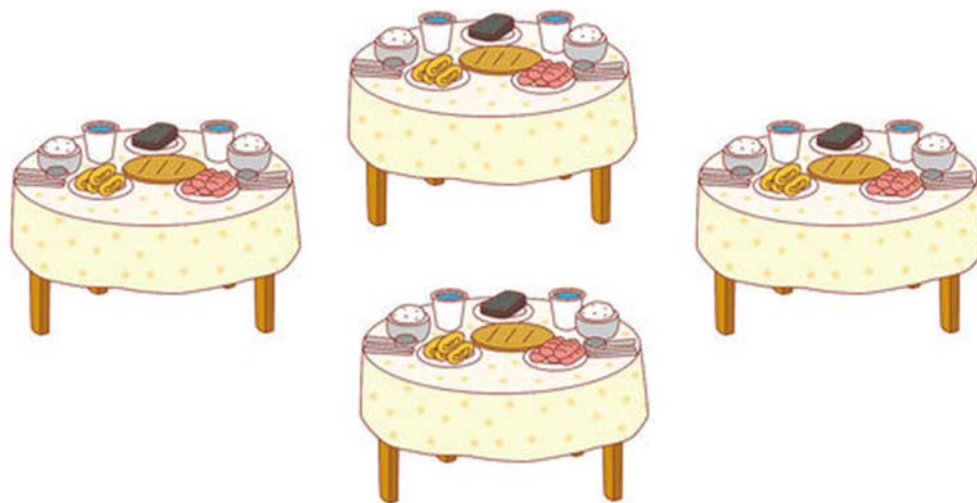

Over the last few weeks, we have been continuously reminded that winter is upon us. Many in our community have mentioned that they are weary of staying indoors and wish for an excuse to get out and interact.

Coming together in community is something that is, of course, a wonderful Jewish value.

When Jacob was about to leave this world, he knew that the children of Israel would soon enter a period of darkness. Jacob knew that during ominous times, there is a tendency to isolate oneself, and that this can often make a person feel even worse. To safeguard his children from this tendency, "Jacob called to his children and said, 'Gather together.'" (Genesis 49:1).

This same pull to come together is found every time we come to synagogue to pray. While Judaism certainly allows and invites us to pray individually, our tradition encourages us to come to synagogue to pray together. God may be found everywhere, but community is not. We must come together if we are to connect with both God and each other.

And we must not forget that our people have a long tradition of joining together over Shabbat dinner. It is often over the Shabbat dinner table that people have the chance to catch-up with one another, sharing the details of their week. It is a time when we can relax and enjoy each other's company in a warm and relaxed atmosphere.

Given the need to come together, and the Jewish value of doing so, Ohavay Zion Synagogue invites you to a special Shabbat Dinner on February 18th. Beginning at 6 pm, we will join for a social hour of noshing and shmoozing. At around 7 pm, we will enjoy song and learning. We will formally conclude around 8 pm, though everyone is certainly welcome to visit longer.

The cuisine for this Shabbat Dinner will be Thai food from Mai Thai. We will have pizza for the kids, and Leah will provide childcare. To fund the food and childcare, we request \$10 per adult and \$5 per child, and a collection-basket will be provided at the door.

At our most recent Community Shabbat we celebrated Tu b'Shvat. Despite the freshly fallen snow, Anat Rubinstein reminded us that this is the start of spring in Israel, first heralded by new blossoms on the almond trees. During Junior Congregation, Jonathan Karp read aloud the story of the old man who plants a carob seedling. You may recall this story. The man expects that he will not live the seventy years to see it mature but plants it so his grandchildren will have fruit to harvest. Jonathan then asked those gathered how we imagine our world will have changed 70 years from now. Of all the answers the one that caused me greatest pause was the expectation that we'll no longer use books because we'll read everything on hand-held electronic devices. This just after we'd finished reading a children's book and had exclaimed over its colorful illustrations! What will Shabbat be without those pages to turn?

Fortunately that future isn't quite upon us. Instead, we're about to embark on a new and extraordinary adventure in Jewish children's books and music in Lexington. The Jewish Federation of the Bluegrass has been accepted into the national PJ Library program. Through the generous support of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation and local central Kentucky donors, Jewish and interfaith families with children ages 6 months to 8 years of age will receive monthly a Jewish-content book or CD appropriate to the ages of the children in the home – at no cost to the family. OZS's very own Simone Salomon is chairing this initiative. The local launch for PJ Library will be in early May. Watch for more information in next month's bulletin and in Shalom.

At the same time, we're in the process of cataloging the OZS Children's Library and making it more multi-media friendly. Please encourage Rachel Staub, the cataloger, in her efforts on our behalf. And let Kathie Kroot know of book and music titles that we should consider adding to the collection.
