Summer In The City

During the heart (and heat!) of the summer we'll start Shabbat closer to sundown - at 8:00 pm, followed by **Oneg Shabbat** - at the following homes:

There will not be a Friday evening service at OZS on these dates!!!

Directions to each of these homes (using OZS as a starting point) are provided on page 5 & will be posted on the door of OZS for each week. Email reminders will be sent the week of each event.

During Shavuot, we read the book of Ruth, a beautiful story of loyalty and devotion.

Elimelech comes from the town of Beit Lechem (literally the House of Bread), but he can find no food there. He leaves his home in the Land of Israel and travels to the country of Moav with his wife Naomi and his sons Machlon and Chilyon. (In Hebrew, their names can mean sickness and death, a foreboding sign.)

Elimelech dies and so do his two sons. Naomi is left in Moav with her two daughters-in-law, Orpah and Ruth. Naomi tells them she is returning to Israel, and that they should remain in Moav. Both of them initially protest, but Orpah soon agrees and leaves Naomi.

In contrast, Ruth replies, "Do not urge me to leave you, to turn back and not follow you. For wherever you go, I will go; wherever you lodge, I will lodge; your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die, I will die, and there I will be buried. Thus and more may the Lord do to me if anything but death parts me from you." (JPS)

Ruth follows Naomi back to the House of Bread, Beit Lechem, in the Land of Israel. There, they finally find bread and a home, and Ruth, through her loyalty and devotion, becomes the matriarch of the house of David and ancestor of the future Messiah.

The symbolism is striking. Elimelech, who's name means "My God is king," should be the hero of the story, but he leaves Beit Lechem, symbolically leaving the nourishment of Torah; and he leaves the Land of Israel, symbolically leaving his fellow Jews.

In contrast, Ruth, an unlikely hero from the Land of Moav, cleaves to Naomi, joining herself to Naomi's people, and finds bread in the House of Bread, symbolically finding nourishment in the Torah. Ruth demonstrates loyalty to Naomi and the Jewish people, and she finds sustenance in God's Torah.

These two commitments, the commitment to the Jewish people and the commitment to Torah, surround and infuse the holiday of Shavuot. At OZS we will embody these commitments by coming together as a Kehilah Kedoshah, a holy community, celebrating Torah together.

Our Shavuot celebration will be held at OZS on the evening of Tuesday June 7th and the morning of June 8th. More details will be included in e-mails from OZS, but following are some of the basics.

Tuesday, June 7th

As a tradition of Shavuot is to eat dairy, we will begin with a pizza dinner around 6:00pm. (Please consider coming a few minutes early for Minchah at 5:45pm) **And please RSVP to OZS at office@ozs.org for the Pizza Dinner.**

Beginning at 7:00pm, we will have a variety of wonderful intergenerational educational opportunities taught by members of our OZS community.

Because sunset is so late (8:58pm), we will be able to have an even wider array of activities, with crafts and musical instruments, early in the evening.

The Family programming will conclude around 8:30pm. Everyone is welcome to stay, as we will continue by lighting the holiday candles and davening Ma'ariv.

At 9:00pm, the learning will resume until late in the night, with a relaxing break with wine, cheese and crackers.

Wednesday, June 8th

On Wednesday, we will celebrate Shavuot with Yom Tov services beginning at 9:30am. During the Torah reading, we will hear the Ten Commandments, and at the end of the Torah service, Yizkor will be observed (approximately 11:30am).

This Shavuot, may we follow in Ruth's footsteps, joining ourselves to our Jewish community and coming together to celebrate God's Torah.

When I got home this evening from a meeting at shul, Rafi had dinner waiting for me, including a creative variation on matzah brei. Well, yes, it is the end of May but we still have some of those leftover matzot from Pesach, aging none too well in the soggy weeks of weather that we've had. Maybe this is a new riff on counting Omer between Pesach and Shavuot – by what day of the Omer must the matzah be finished? And now it occurs to me that in the Rabbi's class on kashrut we haven't yet studied anything about the seasons of food. We've read about what foods are permissible in general, how to categorize them, prepare them, separate them, rescue them, discard them, and then how to do all these same things to the utensils and vessels. All those elements of kashrut: Animal and vegetable; hot and cold; earth, water and fire; metal, pottery, glass, stone and wood – and plastic. But no mention of the seasons.

Yet seasons are on my mind, as we move from spring to summer and another time of transitions. Religious School and Gan Shalom have just finished for this school year. How can we adequately thank our wonderful teachers, parent volunteers and school directors Ilona Szekeley and Amy Howe? The OZS building will seem very quiet over the summer weeks without the children in its rooms and halls. The Rabbi's Introduction to Judaism class also recently completed a year's course of study. Some of its participants are now choosing to take the next steps to join our community – please help to welcome them. Mazel Tov also to those OZS families celebrating graduations – from Gan, from high school, from college.

Another transition later this summer is that OZS will install its new board of trustees, including a new executive committee. Since our next bulletin is in August, I want to take this opportunity to thank the current board for its extraordinary attention to creative and caring stewardship of our congregation. While I'll have a chance to say this more personally at a congregational event in August, for now let me acknowledge what an honor it is to work with these dedicated volunteers who do so much behind the scenes. I forgot to ask the rabbi where in the Torah is written that serving on the Board is a mitzvah yet I know it must be in there somewhere. But as he did say during the kashrut class, doing mitzvot is not about following rules – it's about finding our Jewish paths for approaching holiness. Thank you to our board members for helping to ensure OZS as a space to nurture this across our seasons.

Torah Celebration



To **Janice Crane & John Perel's** home -252 S. Hanover Ave

Turn RIGHT onto Alumni Drive. Turn RIGHT onto Tates Creek Road. Continue on Tates Creek Road ((it will become E. High St at Euclid). Turn right onto Ghent which turns into S. Hanover. Fifth house on the right.

To **Arthur & Simone Salomon's** home - 459 Woodlake Way

Turn RIGHT onto Alumni Drive. Turn RIGHT onto Tates Creek Road. Turn RIGHT onto Lakewood Drive. Turn LEFT onto Woodlake Way, 459 is on the LEFT.

To **Shani & David Bardach's** home – 1227 Kastle Road
