S'lihot is traditionally the Saturday evening prior to Rosh ha-Shana during which we prepare our spirits and souls for the High Holy Days through learning, the recitation of special selections from the Holidays liturgy, and by the blowing of the Shofar late in the night.

Men's Club Annual Clean-up

High Holidays grounds clean-up at the shul, -Sunday, September 25th at 9:00 AM.

On Sunday morning, beginning at 9:00 a.m., the Men's Club will do its annual cleanup of the grounds of the synagogue. All volunteers are welcome. Please come in your work clothes, and bring your gardening gloves!

Elul is here. This is the month during which we prepare for the High Holidays. We pray that the gates will be reopened, allowing us to enter once again.

Admission through the gates is not so difficult, for God wants us to return. However, we must still be granted permission to enter. And so we pray that God will view us through the lens of merit, seeing our good points, and noting our potential to be partners of the Holy One. We pray that with this understanding, God will let us enter the gates.

Judaism has a principle that if we want attitudes to shift in the upper realms, we must first shift our attitudes here below. “*Itaruta DiLeTata Garim LeItaruta DiLeEila* – Awakening from below causes awakening above” (Tikunei Zohar 110b). Thus, if we want God to view us through the lens of merit, seeing our good points, we must first do the same. Before God will simply throw open the heavenly gates, we must first open the gates of our hearts toward ourselves and others.

Reb Nachman teaches us a way to open our hearts toward ourselves, and we may also apply this method to open our hearts toward others:

You must search for the good in yourself.... You must search and search until you find some good point within you to give you new life and happiness. When you discover the good that is still inside you, you literally swing the scales from guilt to merit. This will enable you to return to God.... Having found one good point, you must continue searching until you find another.... In the same way, you must continue finding more and more good points.... Finding your good points can give you new life. (*Likutey Moharan* I: 282, Translated by Avraham Greenbaum in [The Essential Rabbi Nachman](#))

Focusing on our good points does not deny the existence of our flaws, but it allows our hearts to open. With open hearts we can see our vast potential. We can recognize that there is a godly spark that dwells within us and that we can be partners of the Holy One.

Similarly, when we seek out the good points in others, our hearts can open to them. We may recognize that our fellow human beings have flaws, but we can choose to focus on their good points and on the holy spark within them. We can see their vast potential and our ability to partner with them in serving the Holy One.

Through this lens of merit, we can open up and reach out to one another. We can demonstrate to God our belief that the value of holy partnership outweighs the risks involved in opening up toward one another. For the sake of holy partnership, we will make ourselves vulnerable once again and renew our relationships with others.

Just as we go through this process of *Teshuvah*, turning back and opening to one another, we pray that God will turn back towards us and open the heavenly gates.

May God look beyond our flaws and see our many good points. May God recognize our potential to be holy partners. May God open the gates and welcome us in.

Whenever I get the opportunity, I rave about how wonderful a place OZS is, and how delighted I am to be associated with such a warm, welcoming, and exciting congregation. But what is it that makes OZS so special? Certainly, we have been unbelievably fortunate to have had such splendid rabbis, and we are justifiably proud of our beautiful sanctuary and building (although the roof is another matter...). As a board member and officer, I am also very aware, especially this time of year, of the continuing financial generosity of the members of this congregation (but money is not my topic for this column). But a great rabbi, a beautiful building, and sound finances do not make, by themselves, a wonderful community. What really makes OZS so special is the extraordinary volunteer work by its members.

This past Friday, at our bi-annual congregational meeting, we celebrated the volunteer work of a number of individuals. We thanked Kathie Kroot for her dedication to the library, and Shirley Bryan for her constant work over the past couple of years with the kitchen. We also bestowed four awards: the Kathie Kroot Service Award to Harriet Cooper for the wide variety of ways she helps, often behind the scenes; the Education Award to Tina Trent, who has not only been a dedicated teacher but has been serving as chair of the Education Committee; the Tallis Award to Evelyn Geller for her long service with Chevra Kaddisha; and the President's Award to Sue Ezrine for several exemplary terms as Treasurer, among other things. We also recognized the dedication of several members whose terms service on the Board of Trustees have ended, and others who have just begun their terms on the Board or as officers.

We all know how much time and effort our committee chairs put in to making OZS work, and I would particularly like to thank several members who have recently agreed to take on these important tasks: Janice Crane is now chair of the Adult Education Committee, Ricki Rosenberg and Harriet Cooper are the new co-chairs of the Membership Committee, Simone Salomon and Teri Harper will be leading the Centennial Committee, and Renée Reynolds will be chair of the newly created Israel Programming Committee. (I hope to announce a few more new chairs soon.)

All those I have named above, and quite a few others, play vital roles in making OZS a thriving community. But they cannot do it on their own. Committee chairs cannot succeed unless there are committee members; religious services cannot happen unless people volunteer to lead the davening, read torah and haftarah or act as gabbai; adult education can't happen unless members volunteer to teach; kiddush lunches won't be prepared or served without many volunteers. The entire congregation benefits from the work of these volunteers, but too often we turn to the same people over and over again, knowing that they will come through and do what needs to be done. But in doing this, we risk burning them out. What we really need to keep OZS the wonderful place it has been, is for more of us to volunteer our time and efforts. Join a committee. Help with kiddush lunches. Read torah. Make yourself available to help out where needed. Contact the office or a committee chair, or let me or one of the officers or board members know that you are available and willing to help. Of course, we all have busy lives outside OZS, but if everyone contributes just a little bit of time here and there, we can be confident that OZS will continue to be the kind of place that we will rave about to friends, family, and even complete strangers.
