As Chanukah approaches, we naturally think of the Chanukah Menorah. With each candle we dispel some of the darkness in our world. Each candle serves to brighten our lives and gives us hope for the future.

In the cold darkness of winter, this warm light is tremendously important. It gives us an external reminder of the light we need to kindle within. Each of us needs to strengthen our internal spark from time to time, when we become distracted by life's concerns. We all need that light to give us the strength to make our lives bright.

But must we wait for Chanukah?

There is an ancient tradition that Adam and Eve disobeyed the Divine command on the very same day that they were created, the 6<sup>th</sup> day of creation. They immediately realized that their transgression had serious implications, and that they had damaged their relationship with the Holy One.

Yet as the day grew dark, a new and immense terror fell upon them. Adam and Eve had never experienced darkness before, only the light of day. For them, this strange and disorienting darkness seemed to mark the termination and doom of all creation.

As they fretted and agonized, God gently came to them and showed them how to light Shabbos candles. God showed them how we wave our hands, bringing in the warmth; and how we cover our eyes, letting ourselves breath deeply; and how we say the blessing, opening our eyes to a new and holy light.

As they lit the Shabbos candles, God gave them a special blessing, "May the rays from these candles warm your hearts. May their aura invite you to breath easily once again. And may their light give you hope for a bright new day."

The Shabbos candles did just that. Adam and Eve opened their hearts to the warmth of Shabbos. They relaxed and breathed easily. And the light of the candles gave them hope.

The next morning they were amazed and grateful. Shabbos day was just as God had said. It was warm and wonderful, filled with light and life.

Earlier this year, on Yom Kippur, we recommitted ourselves to the incredible Mitzvah of lighting Shabbos candles. While Chanukah candles help to dispel the darkness of winter, Shabbos candles can provide us light and life every single week.

As we prepare to enter Chanukah, let us give ourselves a wonderful gift: the gift of lighting Shabbos candles. We can buy ourselves a fresh bag of tea lights or purchase a new set of candleholders. We can prepare and beautify a special place for lighting Shabbos candles in our home. And we can give ourselves permission to take a few sacred moments each week to light our Shabbos candles, feeling the warmth, breathing deeply, and opening our eyes to a new and holy light.

Most of us are familiar with the idea that a synagogue should be not only a *beit tefillah*, a house of prayer, but also a *beit kneset*, a house of gathering, and a *beit midrash*, a house of study. OZS tries to be all of these things, and does a pretty good job of offering activities to fulfil each part of its mission, but there is still room for improvement. In light of the recent, and very successful inaugural Lexington participation in the Global Day of Jewish Learning, sponsored here by JFB, I'd like to address this month some issues related to OZS as a *beit midrash* (I plan in the months to come to address the other aspects).

The study of Torah (and by this term I include all of Jewish learning), has always been central to the lives of Jews, and it has always been among the most valued of all activities. "Rabbi Meir would say: Whoever studies Torah for Torah's sake alone, merits many things; not only that, but [the creation of] the entire world is worthwhile for him alone. He is called friend, beloved, lover of God, lover of humanity, rejoicer of God, rejoicer of humanity..." (*Pirkei Avot* 6:1). Study is even considered, in some respects, more sacred than prayer. The *Shulchan Aruch*, the code of Jewish law, states that "A permanent house of study is holier than a synagogue," and one of its principal commentaries says that "Synagogues, in which there is learning taking place for short periods of time, have the status of a House of Study."

It is for all these reasons that OZS, principally through the Adult Education Committee and Rabbi Smolkin, makes a continual effort to offer classes for the members of the congregation (and for others). Currently, for example, Rabbi Smolkin is offering a series of classes, Bible Study Wednesdays at noon, Stories of the Sages at Thursday minyan, and Chanting Torah on Wednesday evening, as well as Introduction to Judaism; Rabbi Smith is teaching a Hebrew class on Monday evenings; and, as usual, there is the weekly Talmud study on Friday mornings. This is, as you can see, a varied set of offerings. However, attendance at these classes is minimal, with barely a handful of congregation members attending any one of them. Most of us simply do not take advantage of these opportunities.

What can we do about this? First, of course, if there are classes not offered that you would like, or times that would be better for you, don't just give up! Let Janice Crane, chair of the Adult Education Committee, or Rabbi Smolkin, or me, know, and we'll see what we can do. If you'd prefer an informal study circle to a formal class, the committee can help to organize it, if you wish, or you can do so yourself. The important thing is to get involved.

Of course, for many of us, the issue is not that there are not the right classes or that they are at the wrong time, but that, as we see it, we are simply too busy. Hillel (again quoted in *Pirkei Avot* 2) admonishes us, "He who engages excessively in business cannot become wise." He even responds directly to the issue of time: "Say not: When I have time I will study, because you may never have the time." So, let me urge you, take the time now to join a class or study group at OZS. Study can be exciting, joyous, enriching, and even relaxing. You and all the rest of us will be the better for it. Please, help us make OZS a true *beit midrash*.

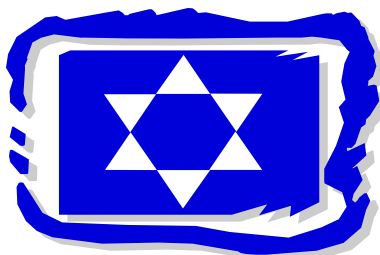
