The holiday of Tu BeShvat is almost here!

A long time ago, in the land of Israel, there were taxes on various items. The taxes were needed to support the poor, to provide for the Leviim and Cohanim, and to maintain the Beit HaMikdash, the Temple.

Different items had different times when their tax year began. For agricultural tithing, the new year was determined to be the 15th day of the month of Shvat, or in Hebrew - Tu BeShvat. That meant that any pomegranates produced before that date were taxed for the previous year, while any produced after that date were taxed as part of the new year. Pretty exciting stuff!

The Jewish mystics thought it was exciting too, though they did not necessarily focus on the economics of the situation. For the Jewish mystics, the new agricultural year was yet one more way to view God's revelation.

Jewish mysticism understands God's revelation as omnipresent. The Divine is constantly revealing Itself in a multitude of ways.

Often when we read the Torah, we realize that there are many meanings to the text. There is the literal meaning; there are hints from the text to other parts of tradition and our lives; there are meanings that we can tease out of the text; and there are hidden meanings as well, sometimes found through the words and sometimes found in the white spaces between the words.

In Judaism, there is an expression: Yesh Shivim Panim BaTorah - There are 70 faces in the Torah. (Bamidbar Rabbah 13:15) While some may believe that there is only one correct way to read scripture, Judaism celebrates the plurality of meaning found within our sacred text. We delight in new ways to read the Torah and call them Chidushim - Innovations in meaning.

When the Jewish mystics looked at the agricultural tax date of Tu BeShvat, they saw an invitation to explore what the Blessed Holy One might want to teach us through nature. Each piece of fruit contained a spiritual lesson. Each piece of fruit had a unique composition that could teach us about ourselves and the world around us.

To celebrate the season and to explore new meanings, the Jewish mystics created the Tu BeShvat Seder. During the Seder, they enjoyed a variety of fruits and wines, and they delighted in the multitude of meanings the Creator had hidden in each one of these tasty creations.

At OZS, the next few weeks are full of wonderful celebrations. On February 4th, as part of the Shabbos of Song, we will honor Beth Goldstein and Rafi Finkel. On February 5th, we will come together at 9:30am for a morning service with Tallis and Tefillin, as the OZS Men's Club helps us to participate in the World Wide Wrap of Tefillin. On February 11th, we will celebrate Sam Chasen's becoming a Bar Mitzvah. These are wonderful activities to participate in!

We can add one more fun activity to our list:

On the evening of February 7th, the evening of Tu BeShvat, we will have a half-hour Tu BeShvat Seder at OZS, beginning promptly at 5:45pm. Everyone is welcome, but please email me by February 6th to RSVP (rabbi.smolkin@gmail.com) so that there will be enough fruit for everyone.

Venice, Italy

We Jews have always done things together: we left Egypt together, and received the Torah together at Mt. Sinai. Later, we all came to Jerusalem for the festivals, and gathered in huge crowds at the Temple for Yom Kippur. Today, we still do things together. While Jews can and do pray individually, we know that some important things, the Kaddish, the Kiddusha in the amidah, and reading from the Torah, cannot happen unless at least ten adults are present. But even more, we come together to celebrate important events, such as a bris, a bar or bat mitzvah, or a wedding, and we join together to comfort mourners. We also, of course, eat together, at Friday night dinners, at the seder, and at kiddush luncheons. We recognize that joy is increased when we celebrate together.

These gatherings happen in many places, but most often at the synagogue, which is why it is referred to in Hebrew as a *beit kneset*, a house of gathering. This description encompasses the two names I discussed in December and January, the synagogue as *beit midrash* and as *beit teffilah*, since we both study and pray most often in groups. At OZS, there are many opportunities to come together, to make OZS a true *beit kneset*.

The first two weekends of February bring several special occasions that will be enriched for all when the community comes together to celebrate. On Saturday evening, February 4, as you all know, there is the special Shabbat Shira celebration to honor two of our most involved members, Beth Goldstein and Rafi Finkel. The following Friday and Saturday we will celebrate one of the most important events in the life of a community, a bar or bat mitzvah. On February 10 and 11, let's bring together the entire community, not just family and close friends, to join Sam Chasen as he celebrates his bar mitzvah and takes his place as an adult in the OZS family.

Sunday morning, February 5, the Men's Club is sponsoring OZS's participation in the World Wide Wrap. It doesn't matter whether you put on tefillin every day or once a week, have not put them on since you were young, or have never done so. All, experts and novices alike, are invited to come together to enjoy a special experience. The hope is that this will become a regular event, not just once a year.

In the coming months there will be several more bar mitzvahs and other celebrations, culminating, of course in the April Centennial spectacular (don't forget to make your reservations!). Let's fill the building every time.

While these are all wonderful occasions for the community to gather, don't forget about the regular, weekly events: classes, Tuesday and Thursday minyans, and, of course, Shabbat services and Kiddush luncheons. All of these are enhanced when more of us are there, so please come.

While in Italy, I have had to miss many events, and will, unfortunately not be able to attend those over the next few weeks, but I look forward to seeing all of you at the *beit kneset* that is OZS beginning March 1.
