FROM THE RABBI

Question: Why should we go to synagogue on the High Holidays, rather than going to work or school?

Answer: Thank you for your question!

During Rosh Hashanah we sing: Adonai Melech, Adonai Malach, Adonai Yimloch L'Olam Va'ed. Adonai is sovereign, Adonai was sovereign, Adonai will be sovereign for ever and ever.

What is so important about God's sovereignty?

The Prophet Jeremiah reminds us, "Thus said Adonai: Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom; let not the strong man glory in his strength; let not the rich man glory in his riches. But only in this should one glory: In his knowledge and embrace of Me. For I, Adonai make kindness, justice, and equity in the world; for in these I delight —declares Adonai. (9:22-23)

So often, the world around us emphasizes man's priorities. We strive after knowledge of things, thinking that the more knowledge we have, the more respectable we will be. We pursue being the best at sports, that they may crown our stunning achievements on the court. We amass wealth, so that we may have more influence and esteem. So often, we pursue these goals, and society supports that end. But that world of greed and gain is not what God intended when God created us.

We live in a world where it is easy to forget God's priorities. We have forgotten that back in the Garden of Eden, God told us we were created to serve and to protect (Gen. 2:15). We have forgotten that God's Kingdom is based not on knowledge, strength, or riches, but rather on justice and kindness. We have forgotten our true Sovereign.

On the High Holy Days, we are called to stop. We cease from work and the gaining of wealth, and we take a break from school and the acquisition of knowledge. Instead, we recognize God's sovereignty and realign ourselves with God's priorities.

We make a statement that it is not all about us and our gain. It is about creating a world of justice and kindness. It is about planting heaven on earth. (Is. 51:16)

These High Holy Days, may we stop and return, to God and to ourselves. May we emerge ready and willing to manifest our Sovereign's deepest desire for a world based on justice and kindness. And may we all have a very good and sweet new year.

Social Action Committee (SAC)

Want to find a meaningful way to help others and get to know other like-minded congregants? The OZS Social Action Committee may be just what you need. For those of you new to the SAC, here are some of the activities we were involved in this past year:

Starting in the fall of 2017, the SAC co-sponsored a refugee family with KY Refugee Ministries. The arrival of the seven member family from the Congo required a lot of work! Volunteers furnished the apartment entirely from donations, moved the family in within six hours of getting the house keys, provided food for the first six weeks, shepherded them to a variety of medical appointments, and then provided ongoing tutoring and mentoring to the family. Both parents are working now, the children are in school and one (who knew no English before coming to the U.S.) even made it onto honor roll during the second semester,

For the first time, the SAC tabled at this summer's Pride festival. Volunteers reported there was tremendous community support for our participation,

Advocated for Fairness ordinances in Frankfort (along with Rabbi Smolkin),

Hosted an On the Table round table event to discuss how to promote interfaith collaboration,

Became a part of the leadership team of the Community Response Coalition to assist families under threat of deportation,

Continued to support Backpacking for God's Pantry.

For 2018 we will continue to devote ourselves to causes that support diversity and inclusion in our quest to repair the World, Tikkun Olum. Broad initiatives for 2018/19 are co-sponsoring another refugee family; working with the Community Response Coalition; education, support and advocacy of LGBTQ issues; God's Pantry Backpacking and supporting dignified transportation for Seniors through ITN*Bluegrass*. MONTHLY THOUGHTS FROM THE RELIGIOUS COMMITTEE

100 Blessings a Day

In Deuteronomy 10:12, Moses tells the Jewish people: "What does God ask of you?" The Talmud, in tractate Menachot 43b, explains that the word for "what," *mah*, can be read as *me'ah*, 100, and interprets Moses's question as an instruction to make 100 blessings (prayers that begin *Baruch atah*), every day. This can be largely fulfilled, for those who are observant, by praying Ma'ariv, Shacharit, and Minchah every day. But for the rest of us to even come close, we would need to add blessings for what we do and experience during the day. In this series of columns we will look at some of the miscellaneous blessings in the Jewish tradition.

The blessings we will consider mostly fall into the following categories:

- Blessings on the various kinds of food and drink
- Blessings on natural phenomena
- Blessings for people we encounter
- Blessings for our own actions

While these blessings of course have spiritual meanings, they also help us to appreciate the world around us. They focus our attention, if only for a moment, on what we are seeing and doing, something that can be very valuable in the hectic world we all live in.

I look forward to exploring these with you in the new year!
