FROM THE RABBI

Question: What are some new educational opportunities at OZS over the next month?

Answer: In all fairness, I asked this question myself in order to present the following announcements... But, since I asked :-)

Highlights of the Prophets: All are welcome to join us **as we take a fascinating tour of the Hebrew Prophets. Beginning on Sunday, October 14, from 10:30am to noon, and continuing Sundays thereafter, this class will be a wonderful way to enhance our knowledge of Tanakh, and deepen our understanding of some of the most central and meaningful Jewish values.**

I am so excited to be teaching these powerful and inspiring texts, and am constantly amazed at how relevant the teachings of the prophets are for our day and age. While we may find ourselves agreeing with their criticisms, I also hope we will join them in aspiring for a world of justice and peace. And as Theodor Herzl stated, "If you will it, it is no mere dream."

Moosnick Lecture Series: This year's lecturer is **Dr. Marcie Lenk**. Dr. Lenk received her Ph.D. at Harvard in 2010 with her dissertation: *The Apostolic Constitutions: Judaism and Anti-Judaism in the Construction of Christianity*. She also earned an M.T.S. from Harvard Divinity, and an M.A. in Bible and a B.A. in Mathematics and Jewish Studies from Yeshiva University.

Dr. Lenk has lectured in Europe, Israel, and the United States, and has taught Early Christianity, Hebrew Bible, and Rabbinic Literature at institutions such as Boston University and City College of New York, as well as at Jewish and Christian seminaries in Israel and the United States.

Dr. Lenk has devoted her career to helping Jews and Christians understand and appreciate the basic texts, ideas, history and faith of the other. She lives in Jerusalem, and for the last six years has served as the director of Christian leadership programs at the Shalom Hartman Institute.

On Wednesday, October 24, at 7:00pm, **in the Carrick Theater at Transylvania University**, Dr. Lenk will lecture on "Truth and Faith: Can Jews and Christians Really Open Ourselves to the Truth of the Other?"

Description: For most of history, most Jews and Christians have rejected the possibility that they have anything to learn from each other's faith and religion. We will examine the history of this rejection, as well as recent changes of attitudes among both Christian and Jewish religious leaders, and consider the opportunities and limitations of interfaith dialogue and understanding.

On Thursday, October 25, at 7:00pm, **at Ohavay Zion Synagogue**, Professor Lenk will talk on "Who are the Children of Sarah? Competition and Interpretation."

Description: We will compare interpretations of the Sarah and Hagar story (Genesis 16 and 21) found in Midrash, and in Paul's Letter to the Galatians, to consider the different ways that Jews and Christians have read this troubling story, and how these interpretations have affected Jewish-Christian relations.

Looking forward to learning with you both in the new class and at the Moosnick lectures!

MONTHLY THOUGHTS FROM THE RELIGIOUS COMMITTEE

100 Blessings a Day: Food

The initial columns in this new series will deal with the blessings for food and drink.

The first question we might ask is, Does the Torah command us to recite blessings before we eat? The answer, perhaps surprisingly, is no. (This is different from the blessings after the meal, which have a clear Torah origin in Deuteronomy 8:10: “When you have eaten and are satisfied, you shall bless Ha-shem, your God..” – more on that in another column.) So, then, why do we say these blessings? An explanation is provided in the Talmud, Tractate Berakhot 35a: “Our rabbis have taught: It is forbidden for a person to enjoy anything of this world without a blessing.... Rabbi Levi contrasted two texts. It is written, ‘The earth is God’s and the fullness thereof’ (Psalm 24:1), and it is also written, ‘The heavens are the heavens of God, but the earth God has given to human beings!’ (Psalm 115:16). There is no contradiction: In the one case it is before a blessing has been said, in the other case after.” In other words, everything, including food, belongs to God, but we are permitted to use it after we thank God by reciting the appropriate blessing.

The Rabbis established a basic formula to begin all these blessings, with which we are all familiar: *Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam...* (Blessed are You, Ha-shem our God, ruler of the universe...). In the following discussions I will save space by not repeating that every time.

The best known of the blessings over food is that for bread, *ha-motzi lechem min ha-aretz* (who brings forth bread from the earth). This is said whenever we eat bread, which is defined as a baked, not fried or boiled, product whose liquid ingredient is primarily water, not oil or juice, which has air holes, and is made from wheat, barley, rye, spelt, or oats. Note that products similar to bread, such as crackers, but that are intended as snacks and not a meal, receive a different blessing, to be discussed next month.

Two final notes regarding *ha-motzi*: 1) before saying this blessing, one should perform the traditional hand washing with the blessing *al netilat yadayim*, and 2) when *ha-motzi* is said over bread at the beginning of a meal, the blessing covers all other foods that will be eaten as part of the meal.
