FROM THE RABBI

Question: What's going on at OZS the weekend of November 16 to 18?

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This month I would like to address the progress OZS has been making on two issues that have occupied the thoughts of our congregation: security and the embezzlement of funds by our former bookkeeper.

Security

In light of the tragic events in Pittsburgh, we are taking new steps to build on our already robust security upgrades (when two FBI anti-terrorism agents stopped by OZS to check in with us, they said they were very impressed with the security measures we had taken, and stated that we were doing just what we should be). During the month of November, we will phase in new procedures for Saturday morning services. There are three elements to this:

The outer doors will be kept locked during services.

Members who attend services regularly will be offered fobs to open the doors that will function on Shabbat morning only.

There will be an usher present in the lobby throughout services to open the doors for members and guests without fobs and, if necessary, to initiate emergency procedures.

In order for this new system to function, we will need to assemble a <u>team of volunteer ushers</u>. With a team of ten, each will be needed only five times a year. If you are willing to take on this important task, please contact me or the office.

We are also continuing work on security and emergency procedures, and investigating ways of locking down the sanctuary if necessary. I will keep you all posted on developments.

Embezzlement

There are two significant developments regarding the unfortunate embezzlement of synagogue funds by our former bookkeeper:

We have filed the insurance claim, which will, we hope, pay for a substantial portion of our loss.

At a special meeting on October 30, the Board voted to accept an offer from the family of our former bookkeeper for restitution, paying us for most of the direct loss immediately and the remainder over time.

What this very good news means is that, barring complications, we will be made financially whole. The immediate result will be, pending Board approval, continuing our security upgrades, and beginning the first stage of replacing our thirty-year old leaky roof.

MONTHLY THOUGHTS FROM THE RELIGIOUS COMMITTEE

100 Blessings a Day: Food, pt. 2

Last month we began our look at blessings over food with the one that is best known, that for bread: *ha-motzi lechem min ha-aretz* (who brings forth bread from the earth). Bread, as mentioned last month, is defined as a baked, not fried or boiled, product whose liquid ingredient is primarily water, not oil or juice, which has air holes, and is made from wheat, barley, rye, spelt, or oats.


Food made of those same grains (and also rice), but prepared in different ways, or when sugar or other additives are significant, is not considered bread, and so receives a different blessing: *Baruch atah Adonai*, *eloheynu melech ha-olam bo-rei minei mezonot* (Blessed are You, Hashem our God, ruler of the universe, who created the species of grain). This blessing is used for a wide variety of foods prepared from processed grain (whole kernels are not included here), in two main categories.

The first category includes foods that in many ways resemble bread. Among these are sweetened products, even if baked, such as cakes, cookies, and hamentaschen, or even bread made with so much fruit or sugar that it is eaten as a dessert. Also included are thin and crispy foods, such as crackers, pretzels, and, despite their name, bread sticks. If a bread, or bread-like dough serves primarily as a holder for filling, such as a pie or similar pastry, filo-wrapped spinach pies or snack-sized hot dogs, or blintzes, then this blessing also applies.

There is an important exception to this rule: if you plan to eat the above foods as an actual meal, rather than as a snack or dessert, then they are considered bread, so *ha-motzi* is the proper blessing. For example, if instead of a tuna sandwich on two slices of bread, which is clearly *ha-motzi*, you were to eat a dozen tuna sandwiches on crackers, that would also be *ha-motzi*, while if you just had one or two as a snack, it would be *mezonot*. Similarly, pizza as a meal requires *ha-motzi*, while one slice as a snack is *mezonot*.

A second category for which the *mezonot* always applies, even if eaten as a meal, includes foods that don't resemble bread at all, but are still made of processed grain, including pasta, breakfast cereals, oatmeal, and matzoh balls.
