

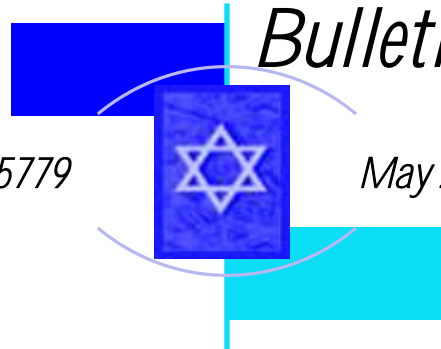

Our 1969 main feature is one of Israel's best movie comedies. Blaumilch is a lunatic with a digging compulsion who escapes from an insane asylum. He steals a jackhammer and proceeds to dig up one of Tel Aviv's busiest traffic arteries. Rather than question his actions, the police and city officials assume he is operating under the municipality's orders, and aid him as much as they can. It is written and produced by Ephraim Kishon, one of Israel's best known writers. Besides the laugh at government's laziness and stupidity this is essentially the comic version of a normal person struggling with huge bureaucracy. If you have ever been in Tel Aviv you'll enjoy the sites that have not changed that much from the 60's.

FROM THE RABBI

As I conclude the series of articles celebrating our recently completed Torah covers, I turn to the moving quote from Psalm 128:5, which is stitched onto one of our beautiful Torah covers.

The Hebrew text on the Torah cover is:

Yivarechecha Hashem MiTzion – May Hashem bless you from Zion.

Zion is the direction of our prayers and the wellspring of our blessing.

After the construction of the first temple, King Solomon prays that even if the people will one day be exiled from Zion, that God should hear their prayers. And God responds to King Solomon saying, “My eyes will be open and My ears attentive to the prayers from this place. (2 Chron 7:15)

This is the reason why, when he was sent into exile in Babylon, Daniel directed his prayers to Zion. And this is why we, for thousands of years, have directed our prayers to Zion.

It is only natural, that as we pray towards Zion, that we hope God's blessing will flow from Zion to us.

Zion has been, and will always be the geological apex of our faith, and Zion is at the core of our synagogue's name: Ohavay Zion.

Now here is where I want to shift to a more personal note about Ohavay Zion.

For a decade now, Ohavay Zion has been my home and my community. And this Zion, in the heart of Kentucky, has been a tremendous blessing for me and my family.

When I think about the incredible people who are here in our community, each with their individual brilliance and gifts, I'm taken aback. OZS has been and shall be a blessing. And, to the extent that one invests in OZS, they shall reap blessings in their lives.

Obviously, here I'm speaking of spiritual investment (though if you are interested in financial investment, please do speak with our treasurer Debbie Aminoff).

In all seriousness, Ohavay Zion has filled my life with meaning, and I am so very grateful. As many of you know, should you choose to invest your time and energy into our community, it can bring tremendous meaning to you as well.

May God bless you from Zion.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

OZS Archives at UK

You may remember that last year OZS deposited its historical archive with the University of Kentucky Archives. Our records have now been organized and a finding aid prepared, so that beginning in about a month (I will let you know when that happens), it will be possible to go to the U.K. Special Collections Department, at the old Margaret King Library, and explore documents, publications, and photographs spanning our more than 100-year history.

Although the documents will soon be available, the archivists will continue to work on them. Some items, especially public ones such as our bulletins, will be scanned and made available online. Other internal items, such as board minutes, will be digitized so they can be searched, but will be available only at UK or through the OZS office.

One exciting project with the archives involves thousands of photographs of OZS activities and members, in the form of prints, slides, and digital images. While some of them were labeled so that the events and people are identifiable, many were not. All of them will eventually be digitized, and UK will set up a website that OZS members can access to help us make the identifications. Later, the older images will be made available online, searchable by date and name. To protect the privacy of OZS members, the newer photos will not be on line, but will be available only at the UK Archives. It will always be possible for OZS to obtain digital copies of photographs for congregational use or for members.

I am very grateful to the UK Archives, and in particular to Megan Mummey, for making it possible for OZS's historical records to be given a permanent and secure home, where OZS members and scholars can research our wonderful history.

Monthly Thoughts From The Religious Committee

100 Blessings a Day: Food, pt. 9

Last month this column introduced the blessings to be said after eating food that is not part of a meal with bread, the *bracha acharona*, or final blessings. This month will be a quick look at the longer form of the *bracha acharona*, said after drinking wine, or eating one of the five fruits associated with the land of Israel (grapes, figs, olives, dates, or pomegranates), or eating one of the five grains (wheat, barley, rye, oats, or spelt) other than in the form of bread.

This blessing, which can be found in any siddur and in most sources with the Birkhat ha-Mazon, begins with the usual formula, *Baruch ata...* with an insertion depending on the type of food: for wine or grape juice *al ha-gefen v'al p'ri ha-gefen* (for the vine and the fruit of the vine), for fruit *al ha-eitz v'al p'ri ha-eitz* (for the tree and the fruit of the tree), or for food from grains *al ha-michya v'al ha-calcalah* (for nourishment and sustenance), followed by an extended thanks to God for the earth's bounty, for the land of Israel, for Jerusalem, and for the Temple, with a prayer asking that we return to the Promised Land so we can enjoy its bounty there, a shorter summary, in effect, of several of the blessings in the Birkhat ha-mazon. This section of the prayer finishes with references to Shabbat or the festivals, as appropriate.

In the concluding section of the *bracha acharona* the foods that have been consumed are named two more times, in slightly abbreviated fashion. First, we praise God for God's goodness, and offer thanks for the land (*al ha-aretz*), and the particular food: *v'al p'ri ha-gefen* (for the fruit of the vine), *v'al ha-peyrot* (for the fruits), or *v'al ha-michya* (for nourishment—that is, for grains). Finally, we praise God once more for the land and the food: *Baruch ata ha-Shem al ha-aretz* (Blessed are you, ha-Shem, for the land), naming, once more, the particular type of food, *v'al p'ri ha-gefen*, etc.

Those three formulas for the three types of food can be combined if you eat more than one, for example, if you drink wine with some crackers, you would say at the beginning *al ha-gefen v'al p'ri ha-gefen v'al ha-michya v'al ha-calcalah*, and at the end *v'al p'ri ha-gefen v'al ha-michya*.

B'tayavon! Bon appetit!

WEIZMANN INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE


The **Weizmann Institute of Science** will bring **Professor Rony Paz to Lexington** for a dessert reception at Portofino on **May 28th, 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM**. More details of the reception will follow. Contact [Tamara](#) for additional information.

Professor Paz is an Associate Professor (tenured) in the Department of Neurobiology at the Weizmann Institute of Science. Professor Paz studies the interactions between emotions and cognitive processes such as learning, memory, and decision-making. His main focus is on two brain areas, the amygdala and the prefrontal cortex, believed to be responsible for such interactions. Among the issues he seeks to elucidate is the precise neuronal circuitry behind the interplay between emotion and cognition, and what differentiates negative emotions (e.g. fear) from positive ones (e.g. motivation). He believes that understanding the basic mechanisms that underlie learning and memory under emotional situations would yield insights into neuropsychiatric disorders in which the link between emotion and cognition is disrupted including autism, schizophrenia, anxiety disorders, and the post-traumatic stress disorder.
