

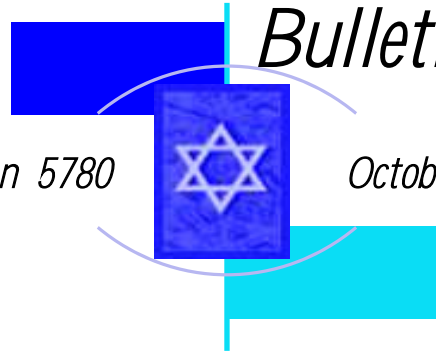

## MONTHLY THOUGHTS FROM THE RELIGIOUS COMMITTEE

### What is a Gabbai?

You will have noticed that when the Torah is read, a person stands at either side of the torah table, in addition to the reader and those called up for the aliyah. What is it that these *gabbaim* do?

The term *gabbai* means collector, in particular of charity, although that is no longer the role in most communities. Traditionally, a person receiving an aliyah would pledge a contribution to charity in return for the honor. Since money could not be handled on Shabbat or festivals, nor could the pledge even be recorded, the job of the gabbai was to remember the pledges and then, after Shabbat or yomtov, collect contributions.

Today, the main role of the gabbai is to support the reading of the Torah. This entails several different activities, most importantly selecting those called to the Torah for each aliyah, coordinating movement of the Torah, and assisting the readers.

The custom at OZS for choosing *olim* (those called for an *aliyah*) is based on tradition. The first gabbai (the one on the left of the Torah from the congregation's perspective) selects a kohayn and a levi (when available) for the first and second aliyot. For the remaining five aliyot, at the gabbai's discretion, we seek a representation of the congregants, with attention to honoring guests and individuals with special occasions. The first gabbai also invites people to carry, lift, and wrap the scroll. Usually, the eighth person called up – the one who then reads the haftorah – has been assigned in advance, so as to have time to prepare the reading.

At the start of the Torah service, the first gabbai coordinates the ark opening and closing; the carrying of the Torah; and at the end of the service, its return to the ark. The first gabbai also 'calls up' people honored with an aliyah, using their Hebrew names (personal name daughter/son of father's and mother's names). At OZS, we keep an almost-up-to-date book of names on the Torah table and ask when we don't know.

During the Torah reading, the two gabbaim share the responsibility of assisting the readers by following along in the Chumash (for OZS, the "big burgundy book" *Eytz Chaim*). Since the Torah scroll has no vowel marks, punctuation, verse numbers, or trope signs (for the musical notes), the gabbaim assist the readers as needed with words and melodies. At OZS (as in many Sephardic synagogues and a few Ashkenasi ones), a gabbai sometimes provides hand signals to indicate the cantillation (musical) signs. The gabbaim also help keep track of our place in the scroll as we transition from one aliyah to the next.

The main prerequisite for being a gabbai is sufficient knowledge of Hebrew to be able to assist the reader. Other skills can be learned, often by serving as second gabbai to a more experienced first gabbai. After the holidays, the Religious Committee will arrange training for any congregants who would like to enter the rotation of those serving this important role.
