

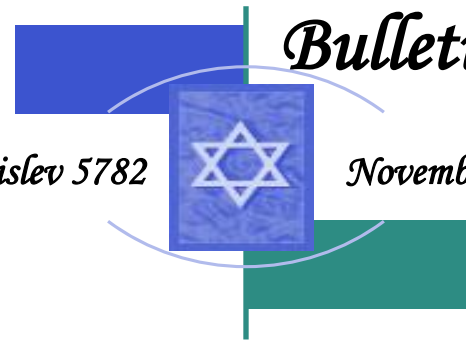

Rabbi's Message

Dear OZS Community,

Another month has flown by. It's hard to believe that in just over a week, we will welcome in the Hebrew month of *Kislev*, the month in which we celebrate Hanukkah. It feels like the High Holidays were just yesterday, and here we are, already looking ahead to the winter months and holidays.

In just the last few weeks, we unveiled and began using our new prayer book, the *Siddur Lev Shalem*, we announced a new line-up of classes beginning this month, had our first Family Shabbat of the year, and all as we continue to weather this strange in-between stage of the Covid-19 pandemic.

I want to spend some time highlighting our Family Shabbat service that took place on Friday, October 22 here at OZS. Thanks to the hard work and creativity of our Religious School Director, Ilona Szekely, the incredible support from our teens, and the amazing energy that each of our Religious School students brought, we kicked off what I am hoping will be a year full of sweet Family Shabbat services. Our sanctuary was full and teeming with excitement. Kids of all ages joined, and many of them led parts of the service. We were given the gift of Torah by Luke Smith, who shared a wonderful drash about the lessons of hospitality that we learn from Abraham and Sarah.

I think our Family Shabbat service is a perfect example of what synagogue life is all about. Together, we created a space and an experience that was meaningful for children and parents alike, modeled what leadership and courage looks like in services, gave our Religious School students yet another fabulous opportunity to connect with one another, and built a sense of community engagement and friendship. And we had a blast! Our November Family Shabbat will be November 12 at 5:30pm—I hope you'll join us!

That same weekend, on Sunday, we hosted an amazing USY event for our students in 5th–12th grades. Together on the patio, our students and teens decorated apples, learned about the themes of the Jewish Agricultural cycle and holidays, and spent time together laughing and getting to know one another. Special thanks to our Youth Group Advisor, Scooter Stein, who did an incredible job planning and facilitating such a fun and successful program!

We have a lot of incredible programs and opportunities taking place here at OZS, for people of all ages. If you are looking for ways for your children to participate in the wider world of OZS, look no further than our vibrant USY chapter. If you are hoping to deepen your knowledge and practice of Judaism, enroll in one (or more!) of our Adult Education courses. If you are curious about liturgy, enjoy prayer, and communal gathering, I hope you'll join us for Shabbat services on Friday evening and Saturday mornings. Our shul community is bustling—I hope you'll take advantage of all that we have going on, and make OZS feel even more like home.

President's Message

By the time you read this, assuming EVERYONE reads my messages, there will only be a few weeks left before we begin to hunker down for the cold, have the opportunity to celebrate Thanksgiving and Hanukah and move pretty much all of our services indoors. It's been kind of nice to have a holiday respite during the month of October so we could catch our breath, get some committees up and running, and consider the work we need to do to make OZS and our community better.

Clearly, the live streaming has been a success. Over the past 3 months, more than 200 people have tuned in and were able to participate in services in spite of Covid and the many other reasons people often can't make it to the Synagogue. What a blessing! Thanks again to Art and Ira for making this happen. However, and just a reminder, we are making it as safe as possible in the sanctuary. People are masked and seating is spaced according to CDC guidelines. I want to encourage all that feel comfortable to COME ON BACK and attend in person. It's my opinion that our sanctuary is a far more spiritual setting than sitting with your computer at your kitchen table. To reassure you, the OZS ad-hoc Opening Committee is following local, state and national Covid statistics and recommendations. As such, we will be immediately advised as to any needed changes, including positive ones, like when and how we can offer Shabbat lunches again.

Lev Shalem is now being used. The Rabbi has provided us with a quick tutorial and I can assure you that it offers us options and informational detail we've not had before. It's going to take us a while to feel really comfortable using it, but there's no better way to learn how to get the most from it than to actually come to services and use it.

Our Social Action Committee has managed to not only reinvent itself, but work with TAI, the Federation and KRM (KY Refugee Ministry) to co-sponsor our first family from Afghanistan, a 37-year-old mother and her 3 daughters. They have a home here. They are being well taken care of and actually making a few friends. I hear that it's been a wonderful experience for those members who have been volunteering to help. We thank you. There's still much to do to ensure they have a successful and safe transition to America. If you want to help, contact either Scooter Stein or Dominique Olbert. They have been amazing pulling this all together.

And while the Yom Kippur pledges have been successful, there are still people who have not made a Yom Kippur pledge or paid at least some portion of their dues. Consider all we do and all we need to do and give what makes you comfortable. If you need or want to work out a payment plan, contact Debbie Aminoff.

I'm looking forward to the future and hoping that the winter months are good ones and offer those of us in OZS leadership roles time to reflect and improve our Synagogue and its services.

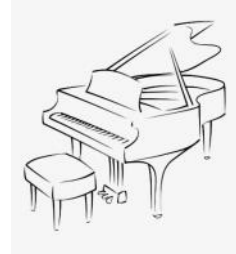

Volunteers Needed for the Backpack Program

OZS continues to participate with the Backpack Program for Mary Todd Elementary students. This Feeding America program provides weekend meals for students who are food insecure. In many cases, the only regular meals these students get are the ones they receive at school. OZS fills bags with food items provided by God's Pantry Food Bank and delivers the food bags to the school every month.

Volunteers are needed to pick up the food items from God's Pantry (usually the 3rd Thursday of the month); help fill bags at OZS (general the Sunday following the pickup) and deliver the filled bags to the school (usually the first Thursday of the month).

We have been fortunate to have a dedicated group who have kept this program going, even during the pandemic, in order to ensure that these children don't go hungry. It would be great if more volunteers would make themselves available to assist us in fulfilling our mission.

Congratulations to Robert Baumann!

Roger and Mary Brumback Lifetime Achievement Award Winner

At the Child Neurology Society annual meeting in Boston September 29 - October 2, 2021, Robert Baumann, MD, Professor of Neurology and Pediatrics at the University of Kentucky, received the Roger and Mary Brumback Lifetime Achievement Award.

Dr. Baumann first joined the faculty at the University of Kentucky in 1972, having been recruited by the Department of Neurology's first chairman, Dr. David B. Clark. Bob was hired to establish an outreach program in Eastern Kentucky for the underserved Appalachian counties and has remained at UK his entire career. The program flourished under his guidance and 9 UK Child Neurologists now provide care for children on a rotating basis in six regional clinics located in the 2nd Kentucky Congressional District, the 2nd most impoverished district in America. These clinics also serve as a unique additional venue for training Neurology residents and medical students.

Consistent with his dedication to service, Dr. Baumann had important national leadership roles that shaped the practice of Neurology in America, with a focus on Child Neurology. He has been on numerous national committees, including NIH review committees. He served on the Board of Directors of Professors of Child Neurology, the American Academy of Neurology, and the United Council of Neurologic Subspecialties, where he was also treasurer. Bob has been visiting professor in China, Ethiopia and Ecuador.

Dr. Baumann has trained several generations of medical students, pediatric residents and adult and child neurology residents. His trainees practice in Australia, England, Ecuador and multiple American teaching hospitals. Many of his trainees came to Boston to celebrate with the Baumann family.
